TRAVELING WITH THE HERD

I’m wishing one of them would want an elephant!

Well, keeping up with the Grand Herd in September was a challenge but considering my weight I think I did a good job. All the food we eat has not helped with my weight problem! We were out at the 100th Anniversary celebration of Dome Rock Chapter No. 215 in Scottsbluff, and those ladies baked cakes—you can’t believe all the different kinds of cakes they had for that party—red velvet cake, double chocolate cake, Sprite cake and my favorite, **Root Beer Cake!** I’m sharing the recipe with all of you since Sisters Karen Nichols & Deb Williamson were kind enough to share it with me:

Root Beer Float Cake

Makes 1 (10-inch) fluted cake

2 - T. Root Beer extract
1 - (18.25-oz.) yellow cake mix with pudding in the mix
1 - (5.1 oz.) box vanilla instant pudding mix
1 ¼ cups root beer
½ cup vegetable oil
4 large eggs
Root Beer Glaze (recipe below)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 10-inch fluted cake pan. In a large bowl, combine cake mix, pudding mix, root beer, root beer extract, oil, and eggs. Beat at medium speed with an electric mixer until smooth. Spoon batter into prepared pan, and bake for 45 minutes, or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Let cool in pan for 10 minutes. Remove from pan and let cool completely on a wire rack. Spoon glaze over cooled cake.

Root Beer Glaze (Makes about ¾ cup)

In a small bowl, combine 2 cups confectioners’ sugar and 3 Tbsp. root beer and whisk until smooth.

If you try it, save a piece for me!

An interesting parable by Dr. Spencer Johnson can bring insight and understanding to the problems we face in our Eastern Star Chapters.

Four characters: “Sniff and Scurry” (mice) and “Hem and Haw” (little people) spent their days in the ‘Maze’ searching for the perfect cheese.

Sniff would smell out the general direction of the cheese and Scurry would race on ahead.

Hem and Haw used thinking, learning from past experiences and their brains to develop sophisticated methods to find the cheese.

All four found an abundant amount of cheese at Station C, but alas, after a while the cheese ran out. Hem and Haw couldn’t believe it and kept coming back to Station C. Sniff and Scurry had been paying attention and moved on to new vistas - finding cheese at Station N.

Haw eventually let go and found Station N but Hem couldn’t or wouldn’t leave Station C - fighting change to the last degree.

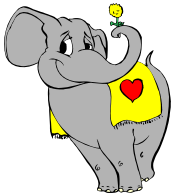
Walt Here!
