### **Cleaning Action Plan**

Before we invite friends and family to visit our homes, we do a little cleaning. So now, before we continue to invite new members to our Chapters, let's use the results of those Chapter Assessments to clean up some of our clutter and outdated things and let in some fresh air.

The following is a sample that might help you develop your Chapter Spring Cleaning Action Plan

The Action Plan describes: A clear picture of where you are going, how you are going to get there, who is involved, the timeframe, and a means to monitor progress and assess success.

1. Set up a time and place for the Planning Workshop.
2. Choose / find / appoint a facilitator.
3. Review and analyze results of your Chapter Assessment and provide this information with the facilitator.
4. Choose a group of people to work together to write the action plan. This could be a Membership Committee or all interested members. To be successful the Chapter members have to have ownership.
5. Ask your facilitator to cover the following items during the workshop:

Prioritize issues

Identify actions that will produce changes

Identify barriers

Identify resources

Establish a timeline

Set plan for monitoring and evaluating

At the end of your workshop have a form similar to the Spring Cleaning Action Plan enclosed for each issue you are going to attack. If the form is not enclosed, email [terryfolk@yahoo.com](mailto:terryfolk@yahoo.com) to get a blank form for your editing and use. Prepare two copies, give one to the person taking the action and keep a master copy. Give all the master copies to one person to use for follow-up. This person could be a Membership Committee Chairperson, Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Chapter Secretary, or your facilitator.
