ESTARL Committee

ESTARL is an acronym for Eastern
Star Training Awards for Religious
Leadership. Our ESTARL program
provided nearly \$16,000.00 in grants
to 11 recipients for 2016. These
grants are based on qualified
applicants need and available funds.
Funding for these grants comes from
three sources. 1. The Yount Fund,
which is a foundation, and therefore
provides the resulting interest only.
2. The Landeryou Fund, which is
funded by \$.25 from each Nebraska
OES member's annual dues and
donations. 3. The Board of Grand
Trustees provides funds based on
available investment interest.
Both the Yount and Landeryou funds
welcome individual donations.

Educational Loan Fund Committee

What a gem of our Nebraska OES.
Sisters and Brothers, could you or a
relative use assistance with the funding
of higher education. According to one
College tuition comparison website 2016

average tuition was \$4678 for NE colleges. Tuition continues to rise. The NE Eastern Star Student Loan may be an option for you or a family member. The Educational Loan Fund became an official program of NE Grand Chapter in 2006. The purpose of the program is to assist members of NE Eastern Star, their relatives and legal wards with expenses for vocational or college education at undergraduate and graduate levels. A loan up to \$2200 per semester with a

maximum of \$17,600 may be awarded to qualified applicants. Amounts awarded depend on available funds, the number of qualified applicants and the total loan amount that the applicant has been previously awarded.
