FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S HISTORIC PARK INN HOTEL

Tour the only remaining hotel designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. Originally opened in 1910 as the City National Bank and Park Inn, the building now functions as a 27-room boutique hotel following its extensive \$20M restoration/rehabilitation, which was completed in 2011. Be sure to stop by the Wright on the Park Headquarters for exhibits and unique gifts, located on the first floor of the hotel.



TOURS: Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Sunday 11:30 AM & 1 PM; Saturday 11:30 AM. All other times by appointment. Advance reservations are encouraged. **ADMISSION:** \$15 per person.



FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S STOCKMAN HOUSE & ROBERT E. MCCOY ARCHITECTURAL INTERPRETIVE CENTER

530 1st Street NE

Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright and constructed in 1908, the Stockman House is the first Wright-designed Prairie School-style house in Iowa. Its open floor plan led to the floor plan of the modern American home. Tours begin at the adjacent Architectural Interpretive Center, which offers visitors a unique look at Mason City's Prairie School Homes in the Rock Crest-Rock Glen Historic District, as well as a gift shop of Wright-inspired items.

TOURS: May-October: Sunday 1 PM & 2 PM, Monday 10 AM & 11 AM, Wednesday 1 PM & 2 PM, Thursday, Friday & Saturday 10 AM, 11 AM, 1 PM & 2 PM. Closed Tuesdays. Listed tour times limited to 6-8 people on a "first come, first served" basis. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to scheduled tour time.

ADMISSION: \$15 adults, \$5 youth ages 6-17 (not suitable for children under the age of 5).

RIVER CITY SCULPTURES ON PARADE

River City Sculptures on Parade is an exciting exhibit of outdoor sculptures featuring works of artists from around the country. The 1.7-mile self-guided tour starts in downtown and loops through the cultural crescent, which includes historic architecture, art museum, public library, and The Music Man attractions.

Step into musical history at The Music Man Square, featuring a charming indoor 1912 streetscape with an ice cream parlor and gift shop, inspired by *The Music Man* movie sets. Explore the museum's Meredith Willson memorabilia and music exhibits, then tour his beautifully restored 1895 Queen Anne-style birthplace and boyhood home.



HOURS: Tuesday-Saturday 1 PM-5 PM

The last house tour begins at 3:30 PM. Visitors are encouraged to arrive no later than 4 PM for Museum and Streetscape tour. Ice Cream Parlor is open until 5 PM.

ADMISSION: \$10 adults, \$5 students (through age 18), children 6 & under are free.

PRAIRIE SCHOOL ARCHITECTURAL TOUR

Tour the largest collection of Prairie-style homes surrounding a natural setting. The Rock Crest-Rock Glen Historic District includes Frank Lloyd Wright's Stockman House and homes designed by former Wright associates including Marion Mahony Griffin, Walter Burley Griffin, Barry Byrne, William Drummond and Curtis Besinger.



HOURS: May-September; Friday-Sunday at 9 AM. Other times during season by appointment. For groups of 10 or more advance reservations are encouraged.



CANNONBALL 457

Built in 1912, this last remaining Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway steam locomotive – No. 457, the "Cannonball" – has been restored to reflect its appearance in the late 1920s. Surrounded by the Cannonball Gardens, the site also features a relaxing landscape of terraces and patios. The Educational Plaza tells stories of local railroad history and the Orphan Train.

WHAT'S NEARBY IN CLEAR LAKE, IOWA

CLEAR LAKE

Iowa's third largest lake and one of the Midwest's most popular fishing destinations, Clear Lake is brimming with activity - on the beach and in the water. A popular site for boating, skiing, and swimming, the 3,600-acre glacial lake has depths to 25-feet and is open to fishing year-round. Clear Lake provides a diverse, healthy, & sustainable ecosystem thanks to ongoing rejuvenation efforts from the CLEAR Project, which has included dredging the west end of the lake. Types of fish: Walleye, Yellow Bass, Largemouth Bass, Crappies, Bluegills, Musky. The lake also offers several beaches and two state parks - **McIntosh Woods State Park** and **Clear Lake State Park**. Located on the lakefront, south of the central business district, **City Beach Park** provides a beach area for sunning, swimming, and water sports.

This beautifully restored and maintained National Historic Landmark holds a place in history as the final concert site of Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and J.P. "The Big Bopper" Richardson and is one of the last remaining ballrooms in the Midwest.

Resembling a 1920s fire station, visitors will step back in time to the early days of firefighting. Built by local volunteer firefighters, this museum—the first fire museum in the State of Iowa—houses a great collection of photographs, mementos and antique equipment. The community's own 1924 Ahrens Fox Pumper Engine—the "Rolls-Royce" of fire engines—is among the displays and exhibits. Located adjacent to the newly constructed fire station, the museum is within walking distance to the 9/11 Steel Memorial. This public display was crafted from an artifact salvaged from the World Trade Center after Sept. 11, 2001. It stands as a reminder of terror, a celebration of brotherhood, to tighten the bond of all who were touched that horrible day in 2001.
