MEET YOUR WORTHY GRAND MATRON: LINDA DUBRY

Sister Linda was born into a Masonic Family with her father being an active Master Mason and Past Master of El Paso Lodge #13 and member of the Scottish Rite and the Shrine in Colorado Springs, CO. He was also a Past Patron of Glen Eyrie Chapter #8 of the Order of Eastern She started her Masonic Star. Family life as a Rainbow Girl in Pikes Peak Assembly #8, and her mother joined Eastern Star to be able to attend the Rainbow meetings with her. Upon reaching her Majority in Rainbow in 1971, she joined Glen Eyrie Chapter, being given the obligation by her father who was Worthy Patron at that time. Linda's paternal grandfather was a Master Mason. and her paternal grandmother was a member of Eastern Star and a Daughter of the Nile. Linda graduated from the University of Northern Colorado with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Spanish in 1974. She went on to teach Spanish and English for 32 years in Colorado and Nebraska, retiring at the age of 60.

Dennis and Linda owned the grocery store in Thedford for several years, eventually adding a grind-and-mix animal feed business and owning a farrow-to -finish hog farm. When Dennis went back to Chadron to get his master's degree in education, he went back to teaching for a couple of years before taking an Elementary Principal's job in Bayard, Nebraska.

After moving to Thedford, Nebraska when she married Dennis, Linda demitted from her chapter in Colorado and affiliated with Sunshine Chapter #261 there. She was elected to her first office. Associate Conductress a month later. She served as Worthy Matron in 1984 with Dennis's uncle Dave Miller serving as her Worthy Patron.
